

The Lowestoft Image & Scores Projects

For the benefit of our newer members who would not be familiar with the Lowestoft Image Project, it is something we the Club, undertook at the request of the Lowestoft Town Council, whose aim was to record the life of our town in pictures throughout the course of one year from January up to the end of December.

Phase one was completed and we had an exhibition of prints over the August Bank Holiday at the Central Station in Lowestoft.

The project is ongoing and we still need pictures from all of you from around the town. These can include the street where you live, major projects in the town, industry, derelict places, town centre, places of interest etc, etc.

The images should be sent to Rob Howarth c/o, lowestoftimageproject@gmail.com who will catalogue them and put them onto the website and hopefully, will result in a 2nd exhibition sometime in the New Year.

The Lowestoft Scores Project is being done in conjunction with the Gt Yarmouth Preservation Trust and aims to capture the atmosphere of the Scores throughout the year, changing seasons, the people who use them, the buildings and their history up to the present day. These images may also be used in an exhibition by the GYPT at a later date.

The main event for the Scores was the Annual Scores Race in August which was covered by several of our members. This particular project runs up to the end of April next year.

The former project is being done in conjunction with the Lowestoft Town Council and for the latter, we are working with the Gt. Yarmouth Preservation Trust which is helping to restore the Scores in a sympathetic way so they blend in with the surroundings.

The Club receives funding from both bodies to enable us to stage the exhibitions and, the pictures then are available to the Lowestoft Town Council and the GYPT, as a photographic record of the town and a benefit to the community as a whole.

Please keep taking your pictures as we need as many as possible and a wide variety of them on various subjects throughout the town.

Competition Print Labelling

Please can all members remember to place on the back of their prints an arrow pointing upwards to mark the top of the image, we have had a few occasions recently where the competition secretary has had to guess which way round the print should be displayed.

Prints also have to be titled and named in the top left hand corner on the rear of the mount as this also helps with orientation.

Print mounts need to be up to a maximum size of 50cm x 40cm It is advantageous to use the size of 50 x 40 cm as this is the only size acceptable for the East Anglian Federation exhibition.

Online Image Archive

At the last committee meeting we discussed the possibility of starting an online image archive comprising of club members best photographs. This would help the club with selection of images for external competitions by having a wider selection of the very best pictures.

This would involve you bringing in your best high res jpeg (not resized) images on a USB stick on club evenings or sent via email or WeTransfer to reederhowarth@aol.com

The images will be stored on a private online archive that only the external competition selection committee will be able to view. Only images from fully paid up members will be available for selection and any member who decides that they no longer wish to have their images on the archive can have them deleted.

We have requested high res images so that the club can make prints for external competitions if required.

No alterations except resizing for external competitions will be made to any of the images and they will be stored as the original jpeg image that you send to us.

Anytime you wish to add to the archive with new material you would be welcome to email the pictures over to me.

I hope as many of you as possible will send us your best images as it will help the club improve our results in external competitions.
